PROFESSOR ESPENSHADE SENDS HURRIED CALL FOR PIPE-STEMS

Pipe-stems are totally absent in Honolulu, according to Prof. A. Howard Espenshade, head of the department of English composition, who has requested that some be forwarded to him at his vacation home in Hawaii. Professor Espenshade, who is at the University of Honolulu during a year's leave of absence, wrote to Prof. John H. Fitzell, of the English composition department recently, bewailing the fact that his corn-cob pipe has been rendered useless because of a lack of stems to fit it.

"Oh, yes, this is very important," his letter declared. "I have a commission for you. I wish you would secure several dozen pipe-stems for my corn-cob pipe.
