FOOTBALL AND ALUMNI

Penn State's football regime will undergo the perennial test tomorrow afternoon when a determined Lafavette eleven, smarting under its defeat at the hands of Bucknell last Saturday, invades the Lion lan to do battle with Hugo Berdek's guidnon forces before a curtical Homecoming Day crowd More than likely the Berdek-coached team will be torn asunder by football-mad alumni long before the opening whistle sounds It is equally certain that the outcome of the game will determine to a large degree the ferocity of the expect-cia attack upon Berdekian methods

Undoubtedly the N Y. U. defeat has fired the ever of the gridion-controlled group. Unfortunately and perhaps unjustly, that setback was the signal for a not-unusual outburst in alumni quarters. Once again a price tag would be placed on the football team, and cries of dissatisfaction would replace cheers of encouragement in post-season deliberations

Withal, this ballyhoo serves no noble purpose. The recurrence of such bally hos year after year has a decided effect upon the morale of the student body. This constant stiring of discontent by football-crared alumnis, from the undergraduate's point of view, the chief obstacle in the path of improved football fortunes.

AN OLD, OLD QUESTION

At many colleges in the East and West the first-year nien "lead a dog's life" and yet very few of them drop out or even bemoan their plight. Perhaps the reason for this apparent contentment is that the customs and for this apparent contentment is that the customs and traditions have remained practically the same since their establishment and have become an extremely vital and active part of each institution. Here at Penn State, however, the present system of customs is nothing more than a skeleton of the original plan Each year, especially during the past three or four years, student gracer month, has been brought foresteen, with the government has been brought face-to-face with the problem of careless observance of and disastisfaction with customs But instead of strengthening the enforcement program, the undergraduate body has removed certain obsolcte and antiquated customs from the list

The University of Wyoming has a rather stiff sys-The University of Wyoning has a rather still sys-tem of customs but it is enforced strictly and no chan-ges are made each year. That institution has found that a strict set of rules for freshmen and an effective enforcement of all regulations is the best possible train-ing a class can receive. Perhaps Penn State should adopt a hard-hearted attitude rather than attempt to adapt customs to the changing times. It might prove to be the more successful plan
