

### Soccermen Meet Orange, Cornell

Lion Booters Leave for Second, Third League Encounters Today, Tomorrow

Facing two encounters the results of which will aid in determining the chances for a Penn State soccer championship, the Nittany booters embarked for tiffs with Syracuse and Cornell yesterday. The soccermen will face Orange booters in the Archbold stadium this afternoon and the Cornell eleven at Ithaca tomorrow.

Coach Bill Jeffrey plans to use his strongest combination against the Bear's machine, since Princeton, the only league team to face the eleven, was held to a tie. The style of play and strength of Cornell are also unknown since the fray tomorrow will be the first meeting between Penn State and the Big Red booters, during Jeffrey's reign as coach.

Syracuse elevens have been defeated by Lion soccermen in the last three years. In a tiff to State College three seasons ago, the Orangemen fell 6-0; two years ago, they again met defeat, 3-1; while in the last soccer campaign, the Lion booters prevailed 5-0-1.

Orangemen Lose Contests

In the current campaign, the Hillmen have lost combats to Dartmouth and Harvard, two league foes, and won a decision over Hamilton, an associate member of the Intercollegiate League.

Satisfactory performance on the part of the entire squad opposing Haverford, prompted Coach Jeffrey to

talk the same men on the Northern trip. The outstanding exhibition of McKune at goal in his first varsity appearance leaves no doubt that he will receive the call this week-end.

Getson, goalie understudy, will probably see service in the opening fray. Hutchinson and Harvey will share the burden of the right fullback post, while Allen is scheduled to fill the left fullback berth. Captain Scotty McLaren is expected to continue his stellar performance at the right halfback post. Edgerton at center half and Strmlan at left half round out the tight Nittany defense.

Lat, scores in the Scarlet and Black battle, will take his outside right position, supported on the right forward wall by Travis, while Debnis and Skinnell will share the center forward duties. Grammar and Mesleman will cover the inside left berth, Mesleman probably starting the fray today.

Anderson, who is nursing a lame ankle, will be held for the encounter with Cornell. Jeffrey's choice between Masters and Tyson will face the opening whistle at the Archbold stadium.

Herb Eschbach, regular pivot, received a shoulder injury early in the encounter with the Violet team which will probably keep him from entering the fray tomorrow.

Kaplan and Edwards will defend the ends with Shawley and Pennecook at tackle berths. Johnny Zarella and Ralph Rucker will receive the guard assignments with McAndrews at center. Cop French will start at the quarterback post. Red Evans and Yutz Dueditch fill in at right and left halfback. Judy Lasech will be stationed at the fullback post.

Perfection of the offense has engaged the attention of the Lion men during the practice sessions this week. Coach Bezek also has been drilling his backs in kicking.
