

Soccermen Face Penn Here Tomorrow As Plebes Engage Syracuse Eleven

ENCOUNTER LEAGUE LEADING QUAKERS

Crucial Contest on New Beaver May Decide Collegiate Supremacy

Clashing with a confident Quaker contingent, the undefeated Nittany booters will face the season's crucial test in what may be the deciding battle for the Intercollegiate soccer crown on New Beaver practice field at 11:30 o'clock tomorrow morning.

The Penn invaders lead the Intercollegiate circuit by a single win. Since they have played one game more than the Lion eleven, and equalled the Penn State record with but one tie and no defeats, an upset tomorrow will jolt the Red and Blue soccermen from the leading position and place the Nittany team in first place.

Establishing the best record in the East to date, the Quakers conquered Swarthmore 2-to-0, Lehigh 9-to-3, Haverford 5-to-1, and tied Yale 3-to-3. The Lions defeated Haverford in the first engagement of the campaign 3-to-1, indicating that the fray tomorrow will be fought by evenly matched eleven.

Keeps Lineup Intact

Coach Bill Jeffrey will keep his backfield intact, expecting a continuance of the satisfactory defensive work. With McKune at goal, Harvey, understudied by Hutchinson at right, full, Allen at left full, Captain McLaren at the right halfback post, Quercio Edgerton holding down the center half berth, and Stumlin completing the backfield at left halfback, the Lions will present a formidable group of defensive veterans.

The entire backfield, with the exception of the sophomore goalie, will face Quaker soccerers for at least the second time. Stumlin battled the Red and Blue as a member of the champion booters in 1926, while the remaining defenders faced the Philadelphia rivals last year and two years ago.

Lutz, diminutive forward, will occupy the outside right position against the Penn team tomorrow. Masters will resume his berth at inside right, while DeBoms, at center forward, will be on hand to continue his scoring tactics. Skennell, on the sidelines, will be prepared to substitute for the high-scoring linemen.

Travis will probably receive the call for the inside left post, although he has been hard pushed for the varsity assignment by Grammar who tallied in last week's fray. Messinger, who started last Saturday, will be prepared to occupy the position in case of need.

Rounding out the offense, Anderson, at outside left, will return to the lineup after an absence of more than a week. Recovering from an injured ankle, the speedy forward, who is in great shape for the encounter, will strengthen the offensive power of the booters.

Fraternities Must Place Orders For Blocks Not Later Than Wednesday Morning

Student ticket sale for the Bucknell-Penn State football game Saturday will begin Wednesday morning with the distribution of seats to fraternities and individual upper-classesmen.

Non-fraternity men, if in groups, may also receive seats Wednesday morning, while lower classmen not in groups will obtain seats Thursday. Seats may be secured by faculty members Tuesday morning. Townspeople may secure seats from Tuesday until Friday inclusive. Pass cards may be used in the purchase of tickets.

Box seats for the game are priced at four dollars, east and west stands at three, and north stand seats at two dollars.

With Al Ott calling signals from the quarterback post, Hoguet, fullback, and Dick Smith and Gaume, halfbacks, complete the Lion line-up. Coach Heermann intends to substitute frequently during the fray. Those who will probably see action are Swan, Brewster, Iscovitz, Guelfi, Buins, Chisler, Peschken, Hartley, Grimshaw, Nebel, Alf, Irwin, Anderson, Metzger, Weber, Choiba, Meyers, Willing, and Cocher.

Syracuse Powerful

Hobart freshmen and Cox Academy were the two strongest eleven to fall before the Orange plebes this year. Aming to provide opposition for the plebe second team, the Syracuse coaches ran the freshman reserves against Gloversville high school while the yearling varsity was downing the Cook gridmen.

work with these three men to bring them up to par to Becker and Detweiler. The contest tomorrow will be the first of the season for the Lion cubs. Greminger, Van Cise, King, Sieck, Spack, Napoleon, and Baud will represent the plebes. The first four runners have been fighting it out for first position in practice runs.

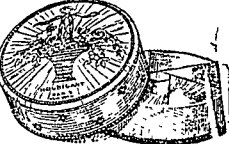
