Professors Everett, Bradford, Wood, and Allen Will Fill Prominent Roles

Four members of the mechanical engineering department will attend the annual meeting of the American Society of Mechanical Engineers to be held in New York city all next week.

Prof Arthur J. Wood, head of the department, will take an active part in the proceedings of the convention and will preside at a meeting of the railroad division of the society, which is studying the relation of colleges to railroads.

Prof Louis J. Bradford will present for preliminary discussion the results obtained from experiments on the Kingsbury journal friction testing machine.

Mr. George B. Karletz, of the Westinghouse Electric company, will read Professor Bradford's paper on oiling bearings.

Prof Harold A. Everett, instructor in thermodynamics, will read a paper on "Engineering Computations for Air and Gas."

### Pond Laboratory Addition Uses 3 Miles of Piping

"Three miles of pipe all in one building and not one foot of them to bump your head on," said the Pond Laboratory addition plumbing foreman with a shrug of his shoulders.

The sixteen thousand feet of piping, ranging from one-quarter-inch leads to eight-inch mains, are so carefully placed and concealed that only about a third of them are visible, the foreman declared. By installing the overhead system the mains are all taken to the loft above the third floor and thirty-five leads are dropped from each main to their respective places in the floors beneath, he continued.

In addition to this intricate system of pipes is an elaborate ventilating system for carrying off fumes from the laboratories.

"The boys have the most modern and best equipped building we have worked in for many years," the foreman stated, "and we have worked in some good ones."

"I hope you meet my boy up here next year," he said. "For he's coming, provided he gets through high school."
