University of Illinois, and study law. The problem was solved for them, however, by a scholarship, and he went to the University.

The Dean was in college at seventeen but for his first two years didn't know what he wanted to do. Finally, he majored in English and, after graduation, taught English and studied law.

While an undergraduate, the Dean participated in many college activities. He was editor of the literary magazine as well as a member of the senior honor society. His scholarship is shown by the fact that he was elected to membership in Phi Beta Kappa and Phi Delta Phi.

In 1910 he was admitted to the Illinois bar, but not coming to practice law, he went with Dean Thomas A. Clark as assistant dean of men at his alma mater. He stayed there from 1910 until 1919, coming to Penn State on September 1, 1919.

His own philosophy of life has been considerably influenced by his college associations. Speaking of his college look on life, the Dean said:

"There is only one way to enjoy living and that is by putting your own effort into it. Don't bore anyone else by continually being bored yourself. The man who turns to the world and says, 'Here I am, amuse

me' is bored about two-thirds of the time." Not even the duties of an administrative office, however, can burden Dean Warnock and keep him away from his hobbies. He is especially proud of certain of these and will always tell one about his last golf game or his highest bowling score.

The sight of a golf-ball perched on his nearly-clean desk reveals what his favorite recreation is. Bowling and bridge are very popular with him also. Then to top the entire lot, he enjoys "dabbling" in writing of the lighter sort.

Smoking as he talked and with his feet propped up on the desk, the Dean of Men revealed what his own code of living has proved.

"Life can be what we make it. We can be clean, decent and wholesome and still have a whale of a good time. We should strive for mental development, not alone as a tool to advance our material well-being, but as a grand opportunity to better enjoy the world around us."

The sun shown in the window as he recalled what his vision for Penn State had been and how it was being fulfilled. Foresight and prophecy were revealed by the new Dean in one of his first talks after coming here. And today he believes that the College has only scratched the surface in the work it can and will do.
