In accordance with the system of open politics now in force at Penn State, we hereby submit the issue which our candidates will advocate:

- 1 Establishment of a swimming pool. We strongly favor the building of the proposed swimming pool at the earliest possible date.
- 2 Golf and tennis on Sun-days. Realizing that the recreation hours during the week are limited, we advocate the removal of the Sunday ban on the golf links and tennis courts.
- 3 Adjustment of sophomore customs to meet present conditions. We declare our selves in favor of the removal of all sophomore dress customs.
- 4 Lessening of the \$5 fine for repeat courses. We believe that the school authorities and the Student Council should confer on the question of lessening the present \$5 fee for repeat courses.
- 5 Adjustment of present R. O. T. C. conditions. We believe that there should be a change in the present R. O. T. C. schedule.
- 6 Revival of certain College traditions. We believe in the enforcement of all College traditions tending to promote a better Penn State Spirit.

The Commoners, a non-fraternity organization, submit the following platform and earnestly enlist the support of the men in the class of 1933:

- 1 All committee appointments will be based entirely on merit, irrespective of affiliation with any organization.
- 2 We approve the "free hospital" plan, our approval being based on the following points:
a. Equalization of health fees on all students and the fact that \$5 each semester is not too heavy for the benefit to be received by the entire student body as stressed by John R. Napoleon '33, Independent candidate for the sophomore presidency, in committing himself to the support of the hospital.

- 3 Persons previously unable to take advantage of infirmary care because of financial difficulties will have adequate medical service.
- 4 Enlarged funds will permit increased facilities for treatment of all illness.
- 5 Emergency cases can be taken care of adequately.
- 6 Entirely in favor of proposed swimming pool only in the event of other classes cooperating and supporting the idea.
- 7 All interests of the Class of 1933 will be duly considered without thought of personal or party gain.
- 8 An earnest attempt will be made to better non-fraternity men's status in activities on the campus.

pital service plan can be put into effect. I am heartily in favor of any feasible plan to solve this problem."

John B. Taylor Jr. '33, nominee for the sophomore presidency on the Commoners' ticket backed the proposal on the ground that it would give students previously unable to take advantage of infirmary care because of financial difficulty adequate medical service and that it would give increased facilities and better opportunities for handling emergency cases.

Although feeling that the tax upon sophomore students would be heavy Earl A. Huston Jr. '33, Lead-Lane color guard, remarked:

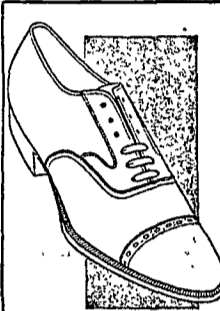
