

LACROSSEMEN WIN OPENING TILT, 7-6

Down Western Maryland After Belated Rally in Second Half Nets 5 Goals

Overcoming a four-point lead in the second half by scoring five goals in less than ten minutes, Penn State lacrosse men defeated Western Maryland, 7-to-6, in the season's opener Saturday afternoon.

Koth, high scorer for the Lions took the Nittany twelve from an almost hopeless position by tallying four goals in the first half. Stibel, who replaced Joe Weber at center succeeded in securing the other point.

The Green Terrors made a flying start, with Ekaitis scoring three goals in the first ten minutes of play. Gonsak, Western Maryland captain, then scored a pair of tallies in less than a minute. Antonson and Stahley succeeded in placing Penn State in the running by scoring one point apiece. The half ended 5-to-2, in favor of the Terrors.

The second half had been under way eleven minutes when Baker added one more tally to Western Maryland's score. The Lion team tightened up both in attack and defense, with Koth entering the scoring column. The Terror twelve played a defensive game from this moment, but were unable to hold the fast moving Lion attack.

Anderson and Edwards, although failing to secure a goal, showed promise of furnishing a backbone for the team. They led the Penn State attack on many occasions.

A strong cross-diamond wind played havoc with the deliveries of both moundsmen.

The Nittany nine scored four of its tallies in the first inning, when hits by Kilpatrick, Ott, Swan, and Stockdale put the Lion yearlings ahead.

Testwuide, who is a junior champion of Wisconsin, offered Panaccion tough opposition through the whole match but fell under the accurate shooting of the Nittany leader.

Freddy Brand teed off with Bill Kirsch, Swarthmore veteran, and after a series of well-played holes the Lion sophomore was three up at the end of the second nine. Three points were garnered by the first two Nittany players.

In the third match Johnny Murray, who saw service last year, was paired with Jack Pyle, another Little Quaker veteran. After a hotly contested match the Penn State linksmen turned in a 79 card to win one up.

The last match proved to be the high spot of the meet when Bob Jackson, Lion golfer, defeated Bill Curtis.

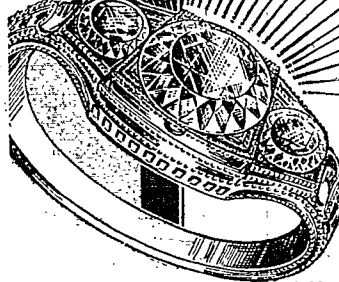
