Penn State Club will hold its annual May hop in the Armory May 21, Clair A. Buzzard '31, social chairman, announced yesterday.

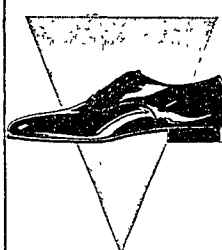
The dance, which will conclude Penn State's season of all college dances, will be informal. The Blue and white orchestra has been signed for the affair.

Citizens From 20 Different States, Canada, Honolulu To Start Courses June 30

Students from twenty different states, Canada, and Honolulu have already enrolled for the 1930 Summer Session to be conducted from June 30 until August 8, Prof. Palmer C. Weaver, assistant director of the Summer Session, announced yesterday.
