POND LABORATORY INSTALLS IRON RESEARCH EQUIPMENT

Additions to equipment in the new Pond laboratory unit include a three-section room fitted for physical chemistry research in pure iron, according to Dr. L. Raymond Parks, director of chemical laboratories.

The new laboratory, completed in August, will be used by graduate assistants in the School of Chemistry and Physics. The room is equipped with gas, electricity, air and water pipe-lines, as well as apartments to house research materials and implements. Lockers for student equipment have also been installed during the summer in the basement of Pond laboratory, Dr. Parks stated.

Will Teach 4 Courses Scheduled by College Catalogue for 1931 in First Semester

With the appointment of Herbert M. Hofford, of Providence, R. I., to the department, Journ 15, copyreading; Journ 21, advanced reporting; Journ 26, laboratory, and Journ 40, advertising, will be given this semester contrary to the college catalogue.

Mr. Hofford, a graduate of Brown university in 1923, has been a staff reporter for the Allentown Call, the Philadelphia Bulletin, and the Providence Journal, and has also been State news editor of the Providence Evening Bulletin.

Journalism 26, the laboratory course, will consist of conference periods in connection with work on College publications. Although listed as nine hours' practical, only one conference a week will be held with each student.

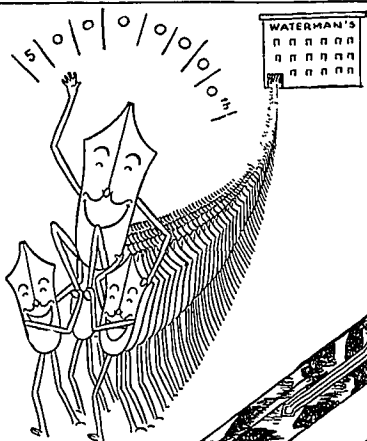
