

BOOTERS TO OPEN WITH HAVERFORD

Soccer Team Will Carry 7-Game Schedule—Coach Jeffries Holds Squad Drills

Penn State's soccer team will open the season with Haverford at Haverford October 18, after more than a month of extensive drill.

On the following Saturday the Bucknell booters will travel to State College and engage the Lion team here. Bucknell was added to the schedule to replace Cornell university, a team met in previous years. On November 1 the Nittany stalwarts will be the guests of Princeton at Princeton, N. J.

Following this encounter the Lions will battle the Orange booters from Syracuse on November 8. Swarthmore at Swarthmore on November 14 is the next game scheduled. They will then travel to Easton where they will meet Lafayette. Western Maryland at home concludes the schedule for the year.

More than forty men eligible for the team, of which nearly half are seasoned material, are expected to answer the first call for practice this week. Coach Bill Jeffries expects to form a hard-fighting defense around Bob McKune, veteran goal-tender, and Bill Hutchinson, fullback.

Coach Jeffries places his hopes for outstanding material among the present aspirants from the sophomore class.

A call will be issued immediately after Freshman Week for candidates for the plebe team. Arrangements are under way to schedule games for this team with high schools from the surrounding counties.

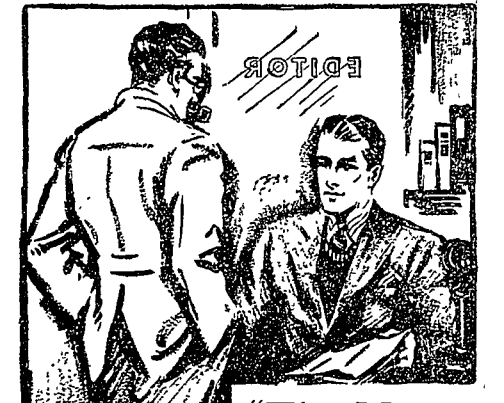
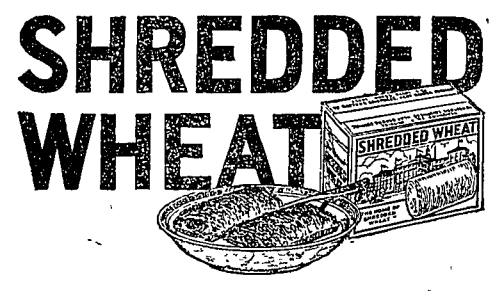
