APPLE SALES FROM THE PENNSYLVANIA STATE COL-LEGE AGRICULTURAL EXPERIMENT STATION ORCHARD

It has been difficult to establish prices on the apple crop this year, but the market atmosphere is clarifying a little with the harvest of winter apples. We are establishing the following retail prices:

All Number I grade of winter apples of $2\frac{1}{2}$ in., $2\frac{1}{4}$ in., and 3 in. will retail in their original bushel package at \$2.00. The $2\frac{1}{4}$ in. size at \$1.50 per bushel.

The Number 2 grade of winter apples 2½ in., 2¾ in., and 3 in. will retail for \$1.25 a bushel in the original package. The Number 2 2¼ in. size will retail at the orchard packing house only. These will be in second hand baskets or paper bags at seventy-five cents per bushel.


Cider apples will retail at the fruit packing house only.

There will be some apples packed in one-half bushel tub baskets that will retail at \$1.15 per basket.
