

OIL, GAS LEADERS MEET HERE TODAY

Dean Edward Steidle Will Open Session With Welcoming Address Tonight

Dean Edward Steidle will welcome representatives of leading Eastern corporations to the Oil and Gas Conference sponsored by the Mineral Industries School in a general session tonight at the Centz Hill country club. This is the first conference of its type to be held east of the Mississippi River.

The guests will be tendered a dinner at the country club at 7 o'clock with the discussion session under the direction of Prof. Connelley A. Bonne, head of the Geology department, opening at 8:30 o'clock.

Following the welcome address, papers will be delivered by J. D. Siler, West Virginia State geologist, and Prof. Arthur P. Honess, department of mineralogy, and Prof. Claude P. Brad, petroleum production research department.

At the Saturday morning petroleum session, scheduled for 9:30 o'clock in room 315 Mineral Industries building, five prominent petroleum producers are listed to address the assembly. The natural gas session will take place at the same time in room 119 of the same building.

The mineral industries students and all other students interested in oil and gas are invited to attend the sessions of conference. Transportation will be furnished those students who desire to attend the country club session.

"This conference, held in conjunction with the College celebration, will mark the progress shown in the school since its institution on the campus," Professor Bonne, in charge of the conference, declared.

"It will confirm the idea of research development and cooperation with the industries in the State and will prove an object of interest and education to students enrolled in the Mineral Industries school," he concluded.

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
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On the cleanest locker-room floor you'll catch the germ of "ATHLETE'S FOOT"
