

YEARLING VARSITY ELEVEN SELECTED

Squad of 36 Candidates Drills
Daily in Preparation for
First Game Nov. 6

From thirty-six men selected as potential material for a freshman grid machine, eleven yearlings, have emerged on a first-year varsity combination in scrimmages last week.

Slusset of Schenley high school, Pittsburgh has won the left end assignment. Rocky, New Cumberland, row plays the other end position, with Conno, Biggs, and Bathniet in a close race to usurp his place.

Zawack, Newport Central high school griddler, has the job at right tackle, with Bydowsky as his running mate.

McKee, another Schenley high school star last year, will probably put in a good bid for one of the tackle berths, when he recovers from a slight injury incurred last week.

Kliska Wins Post
As guards Coach Larry Conover has selected Collins, Morgan Park and Bellefonte academy graduate, and Shaffer, from Bedford high school, Wentzel, of Reading, and Heffrin, Meadville, as second string guards with a chance of getting into the lineup.

With Anderson, Harper, Perry, W. Virginia, slated as the present center Berry and Jackson are other outstanding candidates for the position.

In the backfield a smoothly functioning combination shows promise of clinching positions. Tripp, Westfield high school, now calls signals from behind the line. Morrison of Central high, Philadelphia is rapidly winning a permanent hold on one of the halfback positions, while Snyder of Sunbury has gained the other halfback assignment. Kliska, stocky North Bladock back, fills the fullback berth.

Five freshman contenders have shown up as likely candidates for back field assignments so far. Parks, quarterback, Wantshouse, Pumstein, Jacobson and Harper will probably see action in the first-string lineup.
