

N. Y. U. Denies William Penn Entrance to Hall of Fame

Names 4 Selections for New Honors From 104 Candidates

William Penn, founder of Pennsylvania, has been denied admission to the hall of fame established on the campus of New York university.

Penn failed of election by six votes in the recent voting, it has been announced. He received fifty-eight votes, which was the largest total polled by unsuccessful candidates.

The four members just chosen for the national shrine are James A. MacNeal Whistler, painter, James Monroe, statesman, Matthew Fontaine Maury, scientist, and Walt Whitman, poet.

Fifteen places were available this year, according to Dr. Robert Underwood Johnson, director of the hall of fame, and although there were 103 candidates, only four polled the required total of votes.

Among other unsuccessful candidates were Henry David Thoreau, thirty-eight votes; Thomas Paine, thirty-six; "Stonewall" Jackson, thirty-four; Noah Webster, twenty-seven; Cyrus W. Field, twenty-three; John C. Calhoun, nineteen; Nathan Hale, fourteen; and Ottomar Meigenhauer, thirteen.

Candidates receiving less than ten votes included Francis Scott Key, "Kit" Carson, David Crockett, Jefferson Davis, William McKinley, Paul Revere, Martha Washington, Lydia M. Child, May Dier and Docther Lynde Dix.

The hall of fame at present includes only seven women. Harriet Beecher Stowe, Mary Lyon, Charlotte Cushman, Maria Mitchell, Alice Freeman Palmer, Emma Willard and Frances Elizabeth Willard.

Cyrus H. McCormick, inventor of the harvester, followed William Penn in defeat with fifty-three votes. Whistler, who polled seventy-four, had been defeated once before when he received only thirty ballots. Whitman had been nominated three times previously, Monroe five times and Maury's name had appeared in every election since the hall of fame was established in 1900.

Every state in the country is represented by one or more electors. Included in the list are such personages as Chief Justice Charles Evans Hughes, Owen D. Young, Elihu Root, John W. Davis, George W. Wickarsham, Dr. Harry Emerson Fosdick,

Newton D. Baker, Dr. William Mayo, Dr. Charles Mayo, Brand Whitlock, William Allen White, Dr. A. Lawrence Lowell and Dr. John Guier Hibben.

BOTANICAL EXPEDITION FINDS RARE SPECIMENS

Overlooks Guides Party of 6 Men Into North Canadian Wilds.

Dr. Lee O. Overholts directed a botanical expedition of six faculty men and graduate students, into the far northern stretches of Ontario Province this August.

The party did not limit itself to the vegetable kingdom, however, as the section in which they camped for several weeks has abundant hunting and fishing. Their camp lay within 140 miles of Hudson Bay, on the very edge of civilization. Beyond this point the roads are impassable to motor cars.

Some 800 collections were made, and Dr. Overholts believes that several of these may be species entirely unknown heretofore.

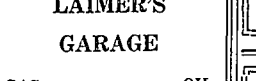

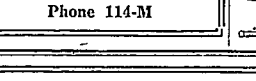
