

PLEBES WILL FACE SYRACUSE ELEVEN

Yearling Hillmen Defeat Hobart, Lose to Cook Academy, Wyoming Teams

Larger to replace a month of preliminary training with actual combat, an expectant squad of freshman griders began this week final intensive drills for the opening game of the season with Syracuse plebes Saturday.

The undefeated Penn State machine will face an experienced team in the first-year Orangemen, who have played three games so far this season. The Syracuse plebes won from Hobart, but lost a close encounter with Wyoming seminar early in the season. Cook academy swamped the Hill team Friday, 20-to-0.

Although they scored three touchdowns on spectacular runs, the Syracuse yearlings succumbed to powerful Wyoming attacks in their first game, 23-to-20. During frequent scrimmages with the varsity squad, the Hill plebes have gleaned further experience.

Coach Larry Conover will take thirty men with him on the Syracuse trip. The line-up for the tilt will probably be little changed from the one originally announced by the freshman grid men.
