Led by Bill Jeffrey, a soccer eleven composed of Penn State graduates and seniors defeated the Celtics, leading soccer club in P. S. by a 2-to-1 score Thanksgiving morning.

Looking over the number of casualties resulting from inter-collegiate football games of recent date, we are of the opinion that it would be better if the tournament were started earlier in the season so the teams would not be forced to play on frozen ground.

Red Duell was the Lion player who blocked that kick in the Pitt game which allowed Earl Edwards to kick for Penn State's second touchdown, according to Harvey J. Boyle, sports editor of the Pittsburgh Post-Gazette.

MacLusko, Colgate fullback, leads the East in scoring with 144 points. He has far outdistanced his nearest competitor, Goff, Rhode Island and Grossman, Rutgers, who are tied for second place with 96 points.

Quintet To Open Season With Waynesburg January 7

Facing the 1931 basketball season with four lettermen available, Coach Dutch Hermann began his search for varsity possibilities as a court practice started this week.

The fact that Jack Myers, veteran forward, is not expected to join the squad because of illness has added to the difficulties of the team. To offset this, the return of Jack Myers, forward in 1929, has bolstered the Lion forces.

Although Fred Brand will be kept from early drills by a recent operation, he will probably be the nucleus of the Nittany quintet when he returns to action.

In addition to Briml, Macomb, Hermon and Raquet are considered for the center assignment. Captain Saltzman is the only letterman available as a guard.

The Lion quintet will play fifteen games during the 1931 campaign meeting ten of their opponents at home. The away games will open the season with Waynesburg in Recreation hall January 7.

Opening relations with Harvard, Penn State will oppose the Crimson on five at Cambridge, Mass. January 17. A game with Syracuse is scheduled for January 20, and the Lions will travel to Annapolis to meet the Navy January 23.
