

60 COURT TEAMS TO ENTER TOURNNEY

Lists Will Close Friday Noon—
Winning Club To Receive
Silver Loving Cup

Fifteen fraternity groups have signed up for the intramural basketball tournament, and forty-five more have signed their intention of doing so. Earle C. Powell '31, head of intramural basketball, announced today to allow sufficient time to arrange a schedule for the games, the lists will close at noon Friday. All games, the first of which will be played January 8, are to begin promptly at 7:30 o'clock. At the close of the tournament, a silver cup will be awarded to each of the three highest teams, while immediately after there will be an open foul shooting contest, the winner of which also will receive a silver cup. Daily practices will be from 12 until 2 o'clock, Wednesday-12 to 1 o'clock, and every evening from 7 to 10 o'clock. The eligibility requirements are the same as those for all intramural sports.

This rule states that all students are eligible for any intramural sport except letter men in that particular sport, and those men designated by the coach of that sport. In case any intramural man develops to varsity caliber and should become necessary to the success of the varsity team in that sport, the coach is given authority to ask to have him transferred to the varsity squad. If any questions of eligibility in intramural sports develop, which cannot be governed by these rules, no change may be made until the particular question of eligibility is discussed at a special faculty meeting of the School of Physical Education and Athletics, and an amendment adopted.
