

CONOVER SELECTS 1934 COURT SQUAD

Freshmen Prepare for Opening
Game With Dickinson Five
Here February 7

Retaining a squad of 23 from the 160 aspirants who reported for the freshman basketball team, Coach Larry Conover has begun active preparation for the first game of the season with the Dickinson seminary trossers here February 7.

The complete schedule of six games has been approved by the athletic board of control. All of the games, with the exception of the Pitt contest will be played at State College. The schedule is as follows: February 7, Dickinson seminary; February 11, Bellefonte academy; February 21, Pittsburgh; February 21, Bucknell; February 28, Colgate; March 7, Carnegie Tech.

Squad Looks Promising
Cutting nine players from the thirty-two selected prior to Christmas vacation, Conover has several fast combinations working out daily. One five composed of McFarlane and McCarter, forwards, Rathmell, center, and Waughel and Stevenson guards, has exhibited strength, while another quintet with Young and Asplund, forwards, Aldrich, center, and Wittum and Dill, guards, has also looked promising.

The plebe cage mentor will be able to depend on a wealth of reserve material. N. Thomas, Leib, Leight, and Knupp are the leading forwards, while Kerr, Henning, Baldwin, and Balthaser, will help to solve the pivot problem, and Blyler, Parks, Slusser, D. Thomas, and Heyson promise to offer stiff competition for the guard posts.
