readure and mechanic arts, scientific and classical studies, and military tactics should be taught or required. Unless the individual college believes that ROTC is an important and indispensable study, there is no reason for making it compulsory, it is Lightstone's belief. He reiterated that there was no other necessary, legal or moral, to do so. That the student receives \$312 for each hour of ROTC is also denied by the dissenting senior. The \$312 holds the military department savings, springs from the decrease of student fees resulting from the annual Federal grant to the College under the Morrill Act. "Since the College will receive the money whether or not ROTC is compulsory, and since the Morrill Act appropriates the grant for courses in agriculture and mechanic arts as well, it is not evident just how the student is paid \$312 for each ROTC hour," Lightstone contended. Perhaps, agriculture and mechanic arts branches should receive a little credit for the grant. "Anyhow," he concluded, "the credit share in the supposed benefits is only fair that they be forced to march around shouldering rifles, if indeed the alleged advantages do accrue from compulsory ROTC."

Honolulu Lures Former Student

Teaching science for the past ten years at the McKinley high school, Honolulu, Miss Louise Larrabee '10, is one Education School graduate who has stayed far from the beaten path of the Pennsylvania school system. Despite the fact that three-fourths of her students are Orientals, Chinese, Japanese, and Koreans, she has succeeded in bridging the gap between East and West and winning a place for herself, not only in their affections, but in their confidence as well. This Penn State graduate has passed most of the 20 years since her graduation in Honolulu. Spending the first year after leaving Penn State in a mission school in Anniston, Alabama, she soon left her native country to teach in the Middle Pacific Institute, a Honolulu missionary boarding school, enrolled solely with Oriental children. Miss Larrabee returned to the United States to engage in graduate study at the University of Washington in 1917. In 1920 and 1927, she devoted seventeen months to travel and study in twenty-five countries, teaching for part of a term at Haifa, Palestine. The University of Hawaii granted Miss Larrabee the degree of Master of Arts in June, 1930. She is a member of the Penn State chapter of Phi Kappa Phi, scholastic fraternity.
