

NITTANY LION INN WILL OPEN MAY 1

Contractors Encounter Unexpected Obstacles in Construction of Plumbing System

The opening of the new Nittany Lion Inn has been postponed from February to May 1 as a result of unexpected obstacles in installing the plumbing system.

Although sixty-five men have been employed in order to hasten construction of the exterior and interior, completion of the structure was hindered by the difficulty in drilling and digging pipe beds. It was necessary to dig about 200 feet to the main sewage arteries.

The Inn, operated by the Consolidated Hotel Service, Inc. of New York city, contains seventy-five rooms. It is a long rambling type of structure of Colonial architecture situated on the Lakes-to-Sea highway directly opposite the College golf course.

The hotel will be furnished with early colonial type furniture in harmony with the spacious lounge rooms and open fire-places. The main dining room will accommodate several hundred people while smaller private dining rooms will be available. Approximately seventy percent of the rooms are double and each has an adjoining bath.

50 PENN STATE FORESTRY ALUMNI ATTEND CONCLAVE

CROSBY FIELD SPEAKS TO SENIOR ENGINEERS

Dean Whitmore Will Give Next Talk in Weekly Series February 6

Every engineer should consider himself a modern business enterprise, according to Crosby Field, president of the Flake Ice corporation and vice-president of the Brillco company, in a weekly lecture to senior engineers in the Chemistry annex Friday afternoon.

In his talk on "How to Make Engi-

neering Pay," Mr. Field urged seniors to remember that experience is the capital with which they will need to start business. He claimed that experience brings a high price where there is least competition.
