

### YEARLING TOSSERS DEFEAT DICKINSON

Freshman Basketball Quintet Downs Williamsport Team, 20-11, in Opening Contest Here

Opening their 1931 season, the freshman basketball quintet won a 20-11 victory over a Dickinson semi-nat quintet Saturday afternoon in Recreation hall. In a game marked by close defensive work on the part of both teams, Coach Larry Conover's yearlings held the Williamsport team to two field goals while they themselves amassed a total of seven two-pointers. Gould, who scored twenty-two points, for the seminary tosser's against Scranton business college. Final night was held to a lone field goal while Spotts secured the other baskets from the field for the losers.

The Dickinson offense was stopped mainly through the fine defensive work of Parks, former Lower Merion star, who forced the visitors to resort to long shots early in the game. McParlane demonstrated the only consistent State offense with repeated fast cutting-in for baskets.

Both teams showed an erratic passing attack, losing the ball continually in penetrating each other's defense. The game was slowed up by considerable fouling, a total of twenty-eight free tries being registered by both teams.
