

WRESTLERS OPPOSE ORANGE TOMORROW

Nittany Grapplers Will Travel To Syracuse for Third Meet of Season

In an attempt to win their third match in as many starts this season, Penn State's varsity wrestling squad will travel to Syracuse, New York, where the Lion grapplers will engage the Orange matmen tomorrow afternoon.

Coach Charlie Spiedel has been putting his squad through a strenuous training period during the past week which has included trial bouts in most of the weights. After a number of experiments, Coach Spiedel announced that the same team which faced Chicago last Friday would meet the Hillmen tomorrow with the possible exception of the 175-pound berth. Jackson, a newcomer, or Wahl will fill the light-heavyweight post.

Although the Nittany wrestlers have never bowed to the New Yorkers in dual competition, they will find the Orangemen eager to wipe out the memory of past defeats. Syracuse has a seasoned mat team and has already engaged in five intercollegiate meets.

Opened Season December 13
These five matches were disastrous as far as Orange victories were concerned but they were all against opponents of a high calibre. The Hillmen were defeated in their opening meet with Columbia university December 13. After the Christmas holidays the Syracuse grapplers dropped a 16-to-9 encounter to the matmen from Lehigh university.

Ohio State and Iowa State universities, both strong contenders in the mid-West and the West, succeeded in downing the Orangemen and last Saturday Cornell, last year's Eastern Intercollegiate wrestling titleholder, overcame the Hillmen by a 20-to-8 score.

The New Yorkers probably will use the same line-up as last week. Forward is slated for the bantamweight berth, while Schantz in the 125-pound division and Anderson in the 155-pound class will get the call. In the welterweight post will be Captain Barry and in the 115-pound class
