#### 8 Quintets Survive Third Round Games—1 Receive 'Byes' In Court Tourney

With the completion of eight games in the third round of the intramural basketball tournament Wednesday night, only twelve teams now remain in competition for the championship title. Eight of these surviving quintets are the winners of the third round while four received byes.

#### Undeclared Lion Five To Face Plebe Team at Stadium Tomorrow Night

Facing a Pitt freshmen team which has lost but two games in three years, Larry Conover's yearling courtmen will attempt to run their string of victories to three when they play in a preliminary game to the Pitt-State clash tomorrow night at Pittsburgh.

An informal practice game with the State College High school Wednesday served as a final warm-up before the first taste of collegiate competition tomorrow night. Although winning with ease from the local school, the freshmen failed to show that consistent offensive which Coach Conover believes will be necessary to upset the Pittsburgh team.

#### Has Impressive Record

Conover will start the same five which trounced the Bellefonte Academy quintet Saturday. McFarlane and Thomas, forwards; Wittum, center; and Parks and Slusser, guards,

will be the combination to take the floor, although frequent replacements are probable. Dill, Stevenson, Keri, Blyler, and Heyson are the other five men who will leave with the varsity squad tomorrow morning.

Although handicapped by the loss of their captain and center, McCannant, who is ill, the Panther hoopsters have a high-scoring quintet in Prydz and Hunt, forwards; Osehnirt, center; and Hughes and McBride, guards. Scott high school of North Braddock broke the string of fifty consecutive victories which the Pittsburgh team had maintained over a period of three years, and the Carnegie Tech freshmen added another defeat later in the season.

Despite these losses, the Blue and Gold team has an impressive record. Erie junior college, Kiski, Johnstown junior college, and Uniontown junior college, have each been beaten twice, while West Virginia freshmen and South Hills high school, Pittsburgh, have yielded once.
