Winners in Semi-final Matches Compete at 8:15 O'clock Tomorrow Night

In the final round of the intramural basketball tournament, two victors of court games last night will play to decide Penn State's champion quintet at 8:15 o'clock tomorrow night. Dean Huce Berlek of the School of Physical Education, will award the trophy to the winning five after the tilt.

LIONS TO ENGAGE CORNELL MATMEN

Will Invade Ithaca for Match With Powerful New York Grapplers Tomorrow

Penn State's wrestlers will encounter their hardest foe so far this season when they engage Cornell's grapplers at Ithaca, New York, tomorrow night. The New Yorkers were eastern intercollegiate title holders last year, and despite loss of several champions, they will present stiff competition for the Lions.

Coch Charles Spedel has given his matmen light drills interspersed with severe bout competition during the past week in preparation for the Ithaca. Nittany grapplers are rounding into fine shape with Maize, Davenport, Stein, and Lorenzo starting in the first four weights.

The 155-pound, 165-pound, and light-heavyweight divisions are not definite as yet, although Reybitz, who can make any of these weights, will be certain to wrestle. Gliner or Roe will fill one of the lighter berths while Copie and Metzger are waging a fight for the 175-pound position.

With Captain Ed Pearce in the heavyweight division, Coach Spedel will depend mainly on Maize, Lorenzo, Reybitz, and his heavy-weight leader to bring back a victory. With but one defeat to mar their record, Cornell grapplers have displayed considerable strength this season. They defeated Columbia decisively early in the year and three weeks ago conquered Syracuse to a 20-to-8 tune.

RINGMEN OPPOSE NAVY TOMORROW

Nittany Boxers Will Encounter Powerful Midshipmen At Annapolis

Lion boxers will face the most severe test of the dual season when they cross gloves with the formidable Navy midshipmen in Annapolis at 8:30 o'clock tomorrow night.

Always a tough foe, the Naval academy leather pushers have scored impressive victories in their three meets this season. After downing the University of Pennsylvania boxers, 6-to-1, the Midshipmen repeated with 6-to-1 triumphs over M. I. T. and the University of West Virginia. The Mountaineers failed to win a bout, the 145 and 175-pound sets ending in draws for their one point.

Four Champions Will Fight Both teams are strong in the lighter weights. Fitzgerald, Wallace, and Hall, in the 125, 135, and 145-pound classes, respectively, are all veteran Navy midshipmen and will prove stubborn opponents for Epstein, McAndrews, and Lewis, Lion entries in those weights.

Four intercollegiate champions will enter the ring tomorrow, although two of them are former titleholders. Both Epstein and Fitzgerald were intercollegiate champions two years ago at 115 and 125 pounds, respectively, and will face in the squared circle at 125 pounds Davey Stoop, Lion bantamweight, who will probably meet Wright and Hall, Navy 145-pounder, arc present crown-wearers.

Fred Babb will try for his first intercollegiate victory against Davis, tugged Midshipman, in the 160-pound class, while Joe Miller, Nittany 175-pounder will try to repeat his initial intercollegiate triumph of last week.
