

GRADUATE SCHOOL REVEALS NEW ENROLLMENT RECORD

That more new students matriculated in the Graduate School this semester than at the beginning of any previous second semester was revealed Wednesday by Dr. Frank D. Kern, dean of the School. Forty-seven students are included in the registration figures. Two hundred forty graduate students enrolled at the beginning of this semester, as compared with 236 last semester. Sixteen students from the School were graduated at the end of the first semester. Some students do not complete their thesis for master's degrees until they have left the College, the dean pointed out.

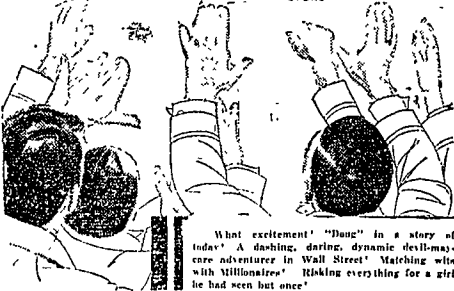

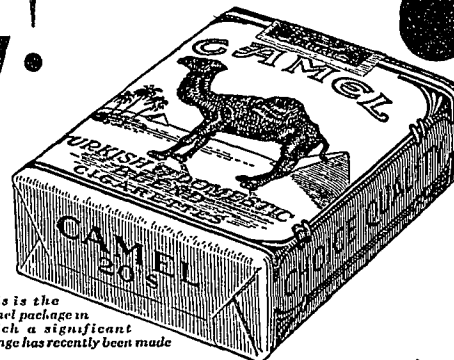
