Maroon Quintet Hands Pkbes First Defeat of Season Saturday

A powerful Colgate offense caused Penn State's freshman basketball team to drop its first game in five starts, 27-13, in a slow contest Saturday night at Recreation hall.

Led by Anderson, a sharp shooting guard, the Maroon easily swept through the Blue and White defense for eleven goals from under the basket while he and Alford, his running mate, held the Nittany pikies to five goals from the floor. Ragged foul shooting was a factor in the State defeat, as the lovers caged but three goals out of the ten chances from the free line.

When Norris McFarlane, State forward, shoved in a two-pointer to put the Nittany quintet ahead, 1-10-2, after four minutes of the first period had elapsed, it was the last time that the home team was to lead.
