

PING PONG TOURNAMENT CONCLUDES NEXT WEEK

Phi Kappa Sigma, Kappa Delta Rho, Sigma Nu Head 3 Divisions

With members of three leagues battling for positions in the final, the interfraternity ping-pong tournament will probably be concluded by the middle of next week.

The proposed tax would increase fraternity individual house bills nearly a hundred dollars yearly, and would drive fraternity men from their houses, argued student objectors.

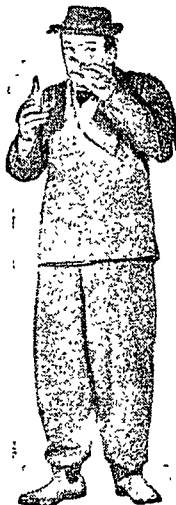

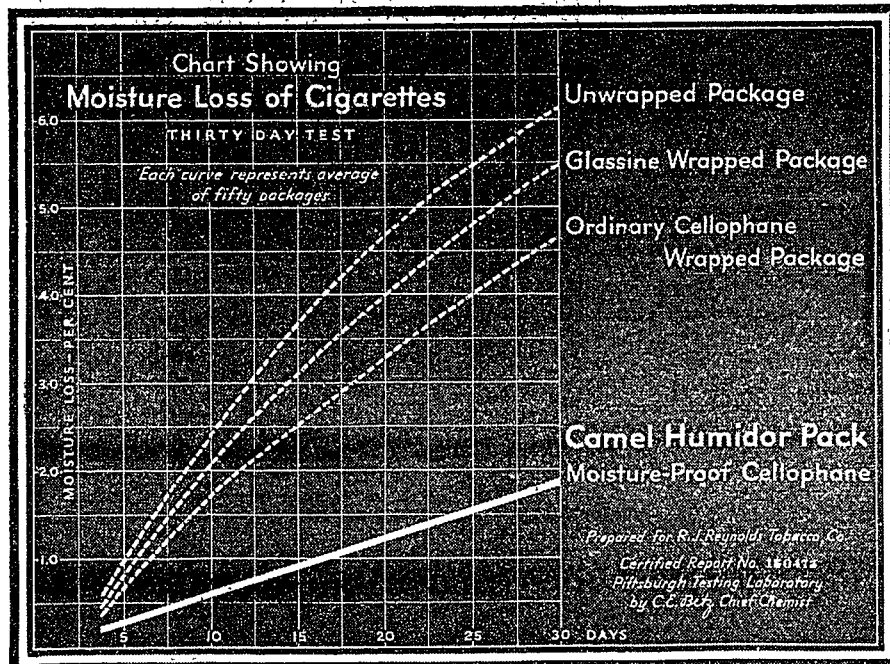
