Chemists, Foresters Explore Novel Field in Maple Sugar Experiments

One of the oldest, and at the same time least known of Pennsylvania's industries is receiving scientific investigation for the first time in the biological chemistry laboratories here, cooperating with the forestry department. Four students are working on the chemical analysis of maple products collected in various parts of the State by Prof. Arthur C. McIntyre, of the department of forestry.

Breeding experiments will be conducted to determine whether trees can actually inherit qualities of sweetness or density of sap, and small trees are to be tapped and tested to prove whether predictions can be made at an early stage in the life of the tree as to its utility in future years.

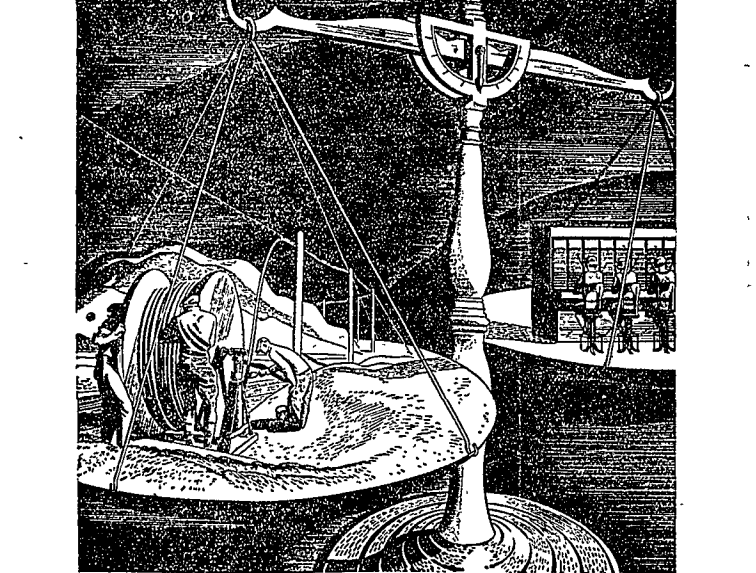
