In Plank, grand old man of baseball, will start his eighteenth year as coach of Gettysburg's diamond team when he brings the Bulls here for the Lions' opening home game Saturday. The veteran mentor's team last year was one of the strongest in the East.

Joe Bedenk believes that Duke has one of the most beautiful diamonds of any college in the country. Set in the side of a mountain, the outfield ends in a mass of granite, and the southern school rarely loses the ball on home run clouts.

Baseball occupies a high place in student interest at Duke. Coached by Jack Combs, former Philadelphia Athletics' star, the Blue Devils are usually among the strongest college baseball teams in the South. Attendance at the Penn State game was curtailed since the contest took place during the Easter vacation.

Although the sacrifice fly has been eliminated from professional baseball, runners are able to score on such hits, in Eastern Intercollegiate Baseball league parks. In the major leagues this year, only a bunted ball will be credited as a sacrifice.

Steve Hannas '29, Penn State's versatile athlete, is continuing his professional career successfully. Steve recently scored his eighth straight knockout victory over Joe Danlow of Los Angeles in the sixth round of a semi-final match in the coast city.

Nittany hopes in the Penn Relays April 21-25 will suffer a severe setback unless the condition of Chick Messenger's knee improves. The Lion runner is suffering from an old ailment which makes his participation in the Philadelphia classic doubtful.

Penn State will be but one of thousands of institutions throughout the United States to be represented in the Penn Relays on Franklin Field. Events are provided for universities and colleges, as well as preparatory and secondary schools.

While controversy over spring football training in college goes on unabated, spring training in basketball has started at Northwestern. Wrestling teams at the Evanston institute also have training at this time of the year.

That students at Johns Hopkins university do not want intercollegiate football abolished was effectively proved in a recent debate between freshmen and sophomores at the Baltimore school. Upholding the negative of the proposition that the sport be abolished, the plebes won a top-heavy victory.

Although the Penn Relays were confined originally to relay events, as the name of the classics would indicate, "special field events" have been added from time to time. Of primary interest to Penn State in these special events will be the 3000-meter steeplechase, in which Dick Detweiler will participate. The rules of this novel event require each entrant to take the jump facing each waterway and to either pass over or through the water.

STATE TO CONTROL COLLEGIATE BOXING

Commission Will Tax, Supervise Ring, Wrestling Matches Under New Ruling

Boxing and wrestling will be under State supervision, with a 5 per cent tax placed on the box office receipts of both sports, according to a pamphlet issued by the Pennsylvania Athletic commission, last week.

Permits for future contests or exhibitions must be obtained from the Commission, and an inspector will have supervision of ring equipment to determine if it is such that contestants are not endangered. This initial attempt at control of intercollegiate competition in these winter sports will affect all colleges in Pennsylvania sponsoring boxing or wrestling teams.

Frank Wiener, chairman, expressed the opinion that the State Athletic commission felt that it would be rightfully held responsible for any accident incurred in an intercollegiate bout since the McBride law empowers the commission to supervise boxing and wrestling wherever it is held in the State.

To Take No Action

Opposition to this ruling has already been filed by the president of Lehigh university. Wrestling is a major sport at the Brown and White institution and is the only winter sport returning a financial profit. For this reason athletic officials complained of the State supervising intercollegiate competition that has been conducted in commendable fashion.

Penn State athletic officials will not take any immediate action upon this ruling. Any revision of the new regulation will be at the instigation of the Eastern Intercollegiate Boxing and Wrestling associations, according to Neil M. Fleming, graduate manager of athletes, who believes that these groups may look to the parent body, the National Athletic association, for support and action.

Almost daily workouts against the freshman and reserve teams have enabled the diamond men to remain in trim for their encounter with the Gettysburg nine.

That pitching will be a difficult problem this year was demonstrated Saturday when freshman batters hammered the offerings of three Lion hurlers badly. The Nittany mound will probably start Meade against the Bulls with Stokes held in reserve for relief duty. Despite his injury, Saltzman may complete Saturday's battery.

Coach Plink's Battlefield nine promises to give the Lions a lively afternoon. Eight seasoned regulars remain from last year's team which burling up a record of twelve straight victories before losing to a Juniata aggregation. 17 GROUPS ENTER TRACK TOURNEY

Fraternity Teams Will Engage in Annual Meet April 29, Relay Heats Following Day

Seventeen groups have entered the intramural track tourney which opens with preliminaries April 29, according to John H. Stewart '32, tournament manager. The relay heats will be run April 30 and the finals on the following day.

Track lettermen, as well as varsity candidates who have secured enough points for a letter prior to the tourney, will be ineligible to enter the competition. A group may enter as many men as it likes, and team members may compete in any number of events, Stewart said. Cross-country lettermen are ineligible for all runs longer than the quarter-mile race.

As in last year's tournament, there will be five places in each meet, first place netting five points, and each following rank one less than the preceding. The regular I.C.A. regulations, with eight field and seven track events, will be in force.

RUNNERS PREPARE FOR PENN RELAYS

Hold Practice Meet—To Enter Track, Field Events Next Week at Philadelphia

In preparation for the Penn Relays, to be held on Franklin Field next Friday and Saturday, track aspirants competed in preliminary relay heats on New Beaver field Saturday.

In the quarter-mile relays, Penn State's four representatives will be picked from a group made up of Wally Fullerton, Johnny McDowell, Johnny Stookey, Lester Yoke, Chuck Kennedy, and Harry Stark. Alternates will probably be designated for this event.

To Run Medley

Half-mile relay men will be selected from six candidates, Ed and Sam Flemken, Ovis Hulings, Johnny McDowell, Wally Fullerton, and Chuck Kennedy.

For the four-mile relay, Captain Chick Messenger, Paul Rekers, Dick Detweiler, Willard and Charles King, Bill Space, Norman Homm, and Clinton VanCise will vie for positions.

The next event, the sprint medley, will be run by four of seven aspirants. The first man in this relay will run 220 yards, the next two men 410 yards, and the fourth man 880 yards. In the two-mile relay four men will be selected to compete at Philadelphia.
