

### Sidelines

Penn State's stickmen will meet one of the strongest lacrosse teams in the United States when they encounter the University of Maryland at College Park, Maryland, May 2. The Maryland team was rated second highest in national lacrosse circles last season, while during the previous season they held a number one post in this rating.

The addition of field hockey to the College sports card must wait until adequate space can be secured to carry it on successfully. Athletic officials hope to have the project under way by next fall.

Gettysburg's baseball team, which crosses bats with the Lions in their first home tilt of the season tomorrow afternoon, has what is probably one of the strongest pitching staffs in collegiate baseball. In addition to Haas, their left-handed star, the Battlefield nine has Utz and Klopp, two hurlers who can usually be depended on to last a full nine innings in the pitcher's box.

Over twenty undergrads are receiving instruction in golf twice each week as a substitute for the course in physical education. Although the classes meet in the open and those taking the subject must bring golf clubs, the new curriculum is primarily a lecture course.

Marsh, freshman first baseman, is the kind of hitter to gladden a coach's heart. His long distance clouting has been a factor in the yearling nine's providing varsity teams with stubborn opposition during their almost daily practice work-outs. Baseball officials expect the inter-class games to develop many men of varsity calibre.

When Fred Brand assumes the captaincy of next year's Nittany court team, he will be the third Lion center to hold this post in five years. Lou Reilly led the quintet in 1929, while Mike Harris was chosen to the captaincy in 1927.

Bob McNamara, gridiron star for N.Y.U., is one of the mainstays of the pitching staff of the Violet baseball team. McNamara turned in a brilliant performance last week, limiting Holy Cross's championship nine to one hit. In chalking up the 77-to-1 victory, the football flash struck out ten men. He issued not one free pass to first base, and no Crusader batsman reached the second sack.

When Penn State meets Syracuse batsmen on the field of the Hillmen May 1, it will mark the home team's first appearance of the season in Syracuse, although they will have already encountered Rochester, Boston college, and Harvard in foreign tilts.

### BATSMEN TO PLAY GETTYSBURG HERE

**Diamondmen Open Home Season In Contest With Bullet Team Tomorrow**

A veteran Gettysburg nine will face Penn State's varsity baseball team experienced opposition in the Lion's first home game at 2:30 o'clock tomorrow afternoon on Beaver field. Dave Meade will carry Nittany hopes of victory to the pitching mound, Coach Joe Bedenk announced yesterday. Although handicapped by a split finger, Sol Saltzman, veteran catcher, will complete the opening day battery. Bunny Stokes, experienced hurler of last year's campaign, will be available for relief duty, if necessary.

With Young at first base, Captain Jack Livezey at the second sack, Musser at the "hot corner," and Smith in the short-stop position, the same infield which performed brilliantly against Duke will play against the Bullets tomorrow, according to the Nittany mentor.

Bill will start in left field, Yutz Diehlich will take the center field post, and Hoopes will get the call for the right garden assignment. Nittany strategy will see Hobbs on Stockdale to right field in the event that Coach Ira Plank of the Battlefield nine should start Lefty Haas, his pitching ace, Bedenk indicated. Little is known of the team which will face the Lions tomorrow afternoon, although last year Gettysburg had one of the strongest teams in the East, winning twelve straight games. Eight of these veterans are included in this season's aggregation.
