

### GLEEMEN TO GIVE VARIETY CONCERT

Will Present Annual Mothers' Day Vaudeville Program Tomorrow Night

The Glee club will give its annual Mothers' Day vaudeville and concert in Schwab auditorium at 8:15 o'clock tomorrow night. Chorus, solo, and quartet vocal selections, piano duets, and magic tricks will make up the program.

Three numbers by the entire club will be presented first. "The Pilot" by Protheroe, "My Prayers" by Flagler, and "John Peel," an old English hunting song Robert McFall '23 will appear next with two baritone solos, "Mother o' Mine" by Burleigh, and "Even Bravest Hearts" by Gounod. Marion Kerr, of the department of music, and Harold F. Hetrick '22 will play Arensky's "Waltz in A-flat," an arrangement for two pianos.

The third division of the program will consist of several popular selections sung by the Varsity male quartet.

To Give Last Performance "Open Road" by Suckles, and "A Chip of the Old Block" by Squin, baritone solos, are to be presented by William H. Stine '23, followed by selected numbers featuring the Varsity quartet. Robert G. Thasher '21 is scheduled to give his last magical performance as an undergraduate in the seventh number of the program. "Swing Along" by Cook, followed by two Russian folk songs, "At Father's Door" and "Enfances," will be sung by the Glee club as the concluding numbers on the program. Mrs. Irene O. Grant, of the department of music, and W. Jay Kennedy '21 are to act as accompanists.


