

Bob Higgins, Lion Football Mentor, To Teach Coaches

Former Nittany Court Star in Charge of Basketball

Bob Higgins, head coach of Penn State's gridiron eleven, will offer a three weeks course in football coaching during the Summer Session. Ken Loeffler, coach of Geneva's basketball team and former Penn State graduate, will conduct a three weeks course in basketball coaching, immediately following the football course.

Both subjects are designed especially for coaches in high schools and normal schools. Under Higgins the class will undertake intensive study covering theory and practice in fundamentals, offensive formations and plays, defensive formations for all styles of play, individual positions, strategy, and interpretation of rules. Special subjects to be discussed include linemen as interferers in offensive play, methods of defense to the forward pass, quarterback strategy, and preparing a team for a game.

of rose brick with white stone trimmings, conforming with other buildings erected on the campus recently. The dairy building will be placed directly in front of the dairy barns. A two-story unit for classrooms, laboratories and offices will be placed near the main building, while the creamery will be located in the rear of the structure.

The home economics building will be placed between McAllister hall and the former Mining building. This structure will be three stories, high and will be similar in design to the Main Engineering building. It will consist of a central unit with a wing at each end.

The College began work on the new buildings as soon as the plans were approved by the Board of Trustees. The plumbing and electrical work is being handled entirely by the department of grounds and buildings. It is expected that all main pipe lines and conduits will be completed in a short time so that builders can start work as soon as the contracts are let.

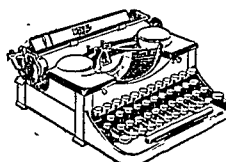

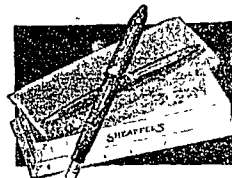
