

PIKE DEALS WITH LOST PERSONALITY

he proceeded to lift it for me. He spoke in the third person. "I guess you know where he went. He had a personality age of three."

Personality may be lost through disease, or it may never develop, the clinical psychiatrist said. He cited the case of a former college professor at Danville whom disease had robbed of personality, so that he asks, "May Joshua go to the movies?"

Not only may personality be lost, but it may be replaced by another personality, the physician explained. From this superimposition of one personality upon another come the Napoleons, the kings of England, the Caesars that through insane asylums, the Caesars that through insane asylums, the Caesars that through insane asylums...

The final group of mental deficient under the head of those who have lost personality are the psychopathic personalities, or moral imbeciles, Dr. Pike said. Morally, these people have an age of from three to seven years. They may be brilliant otherwise, but cannot turn their talents to account.

"The type," he said, "is often seen in the reformer whose conduct is not consistent with his ideas. The world, to him, is ruled by what he believes. He obeys no law but instinct."

"The true thief is wrong mentally," he said. One hundred boys in the juvenile courts of Boston who were examined had committed an average of eighteen crimes apiece.

"Of 1719 youths at Huntington reformatory, only fifteen percent are of normal intelligence," he said. "Sixty percent of those in correctional institutions today are mentally abnormal."

"It is not a question of 'What did he do?'" said Dr. Pike, "but of 'Why did he do it?'"

"Seventy-five percent of the prostitutes examined in one city were found to be psychopathic," he declared. "Fifty percent had a mental age of six. These women were not immoral—they were simply unmoored."

The psychopathic individual can be recognized when he is six, the doctor said. Not only can he be discovered, but the crime which he is most likely to commit can also be detected. It is possible to overlay this psychopathic tendency with habit formation in sixty percent of all those cases found out before puberty, he declared.

In making a plea that such cases be discovered and treated, he warned that four percent of the boys and girls who were being taught today were psychopathic.

most difficult of activities, he believes. The short-story has been changed from an art into a standardized product, he declared. Its form is better known to the American public than that of a motor-car.

In speaking of the present trend to vulgarity in literature, Mr. McFee said that it's not necessary to be a disgusting writer to be a good writer.

Get It Across to Aunt Bessie "It is much more clever to put a story over to Aunt Bessie as well as the ice-man," he said. "The ice-man school of literature is unfortunately in vogue today. If Hemingway had left the obscenity out of 'A Farewell to Arms,' it would have been a far better book."

Discussing the salesmanship of the short story, Mr. McFee recalled that people read slowly. Editors want action stories, he said. The speaker told of a friend of his who wrote about the "Red Wolf," patterning every story about the one simple character, and writing every story on the same basis.

The type of fiction to which this writer contributes is easily recognized, according to the New England novelist. It is all the same, all swift, all simple, easily read, with no necessity for effort on the part of the reader at all.

Yet aside from the money, who wants to write that way? The originator of the Red Wolf was contemptuous himself of the things he did for money, Mr. McFee said.

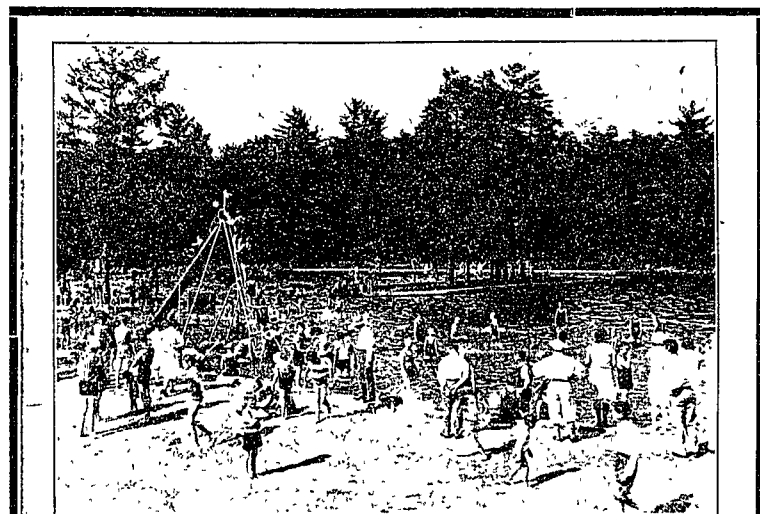
