

Activity Records Aid College News Service

Students Will Fill Out New Cards During Registration

As an aid to the department of public information, each student is required to fill out a student activities card at first semester registration. This system, which was tried for the first time last year, has proved of great value to the department in preparation of news releases, according to Wes W. Dunlap of the news service staff.

"Although a few students failed to co-operate by answering the questions correctly last year, the number of delinquents was surprisingly small," Mr. Dunlap stated. "However, students should be made to understand that data contained on the cards is considered confidential and used only for reference in the department office."

"The cards are particularly helpful at graduation time, when they may be consulted as a record of students' activities while in College. Such questions as 'What daily and weekly newspapers are read in your home,' are designed so that College news may be directed to those newspapers," Mr. Dunlap said.

Freshman cards differ from those of other classes in that space is provided for listing high school activities, while other classes are asked to report on activities pursued in College. Seniors will state the time of expected graduation instead of their father's occupation and newspapers read in their homes.

The three upper classes are directed to give information on the percentage of money they have earned toward their College expenses. First year students will state how much money they expect to earn for this purpose. For the convenience of de-

NAVY GRADUATES ENROLL HERE FOR DESIGN COURSES

Eight graduates of the United States Naval Academy at Annapolis, Md., are taking graduate courses in mechanical design in the School of Engineering.

Each year, graduates of the Academy are sent here for study, following a naval cruise and a year's graduate work at Annapolis. The United States Navy provides some of the equipment for their study here.

Branch Attendance Decreases

With a total enrollment of 4,350 students in the department of engineering extension during 1930-31, a decrease of 1,916 in attendance was announced by Prof. J. Orvis Kille, head of the department. The enrollment in 1929-30 was 6,266.

Department workers, students are requested on the cards to spell surnames out in full.

Activities cards will be in blue, salmon, white, canary, and pink colors in order of class, from seniors to special students. They will not be included as a regular section of the blanket registration form but will appear separately.

2 Rising Bovines Challenge Fame Of Dead Jessies

Challenging the campus fame of "Penn State Jessies I and II," two newcomers have claimed college bovine honors.

The recent notoriety of "Kimwar Pauline Burke" and "Josie Aggie Princess" is based on their perfected ability to yield thirty-five and thirty-four quarts of milk respectively every day in the past year of 365 days.

Both cows produced an average of 27,000 pounds of milk each last year. The leading contender, weighing 1350 pounds, produced more than twenty times her own weight.

Readings taken from July, 1930, to last July show that "Josie" produced 26,928 pounds of milk, while her rival bettered her with a small margin over the 27,000 mark.

partitions lining both sides of the halls on the ground and first floors open the laboratories to the full view of visitors.

The home economics building will assume an E-shape and will follow a modified Georgian architecture similar to the Main Engineering building. The superstructure above the ground floor will be largely brick with limestone trimming.

In addition to classes, laboratories, and administration offices, the struc-

ture will contain a well-planned, modern nursery school in the center wing on the ground floor. A small cafeteria to be used in phases of class work will be installed in the south wing.

Will Utilize Old Building.

What disposal will be made of the old dairy building upon the completion of the new structure has not been definitely decided yet. Facilities for the bacteriology department will likely be increased on the second floor, while the first floor will probably be used for an agricultural library.

The present quarters in the women's building now used by the home economics department will likely undergo extensive remodeling next Fall with a view to utilizing the space for women's dormitories.

The two buildings now under con-

struction are the result of a special appropriations bill of \$910,000 for construction recommended by Governor Gifford Pinchot on February 2 and passed by the State Legislature late in March.
