Tomorrow's clash in Philadelphia will bring together as rival coaches two "teammates" on Walter Camp's All-American team of 1919. Bob Higgins, Lion mentor and Heime Miller, Temple coach, were the ends on Camp's mythical all-star team that year.

According to the weight chart posted on the wall of the Temple University locker room, the average weight of the entire squad is 185 pounds, six pounds more than last year's aggregation, while the medium height of the group is slightly over 5 feet 10 inches.

Joseph Bannak, captain of the Owl eleven and regular guard for the last two seasons, lives in Great Falls, Mont. Thomas Graham, elongated end veteran, travelled the longer distance to the Temple training camp as he resides in Alhambra, Cal.

Captains of five sports are playing on Penn's football team. They are Tanser, basketball captain; Raffel, lacrosse leader; Sokols, wrestling captain; Graupner, baseball leader; and Riblett, grid captain.

Brothers playing on the same football team is not an uncommon thing at Temple. This year the Rubins and the Gudds have taken the places of the Hansens and one of the two Bonner brothers. Corny Bonner, brother of Jack, last year's captain, completes his four-year course in June.

Already Coach Bob Higgins has been hit hard by injuries. During the past week Bob Snyder, Doc Conn, and Tom Harper, all backs, have been on the casualty list, and it is certain that not one will start against Temple.

With the opening soccer game scheduled for next Saturday here against Western Maryland, Coach Bill Jeffrey has sifted twenty-two first-string booters in stiff competition for berths on the opening line-up. In the race for half-back positions, Bill Shea and Bob Young are candidates for right half-back, Bob Siegel and Al Daykin compete for center while Frank Evans seems the logical man for left half-back.

Will Scrimmage Tomorrow Shorty Edwards is giving George Schwartz a battle for the outside right post. Two veterans, Dutch Miller and Shorty Musser, are challenged by John Hipple for inside right.

Center forward rests between two sophomores, Eddie Knecht and Bradford, while Herb Masters and Wesley compete for inside left forward. Bill Tyson and Jim Altemus are the outstanding candidates for outside left forward.


