

WATTS ANNOUNCES SERIES LECTURERS

Mairs Chooses 'From Sumpter to The Alamo' as Subject For Wednesday

The names of the seventeen remaining speakers in the general lecture series sponsored by the School of Agriculture were released yesterday by Denn Ralph L. Watts.

Dr. M. A. Jull of the Federal Bureau of animal industry will discuss problems encountered in his department, November 11.

Following Dr. E. V. McCollum Johns Hopkins University, the Hon. John A. McSparran, secretary of the State Department of Agriculture, will give an address on December 16.

Other speakers on the program, which is to continue until April 20, are Ralph B. Starkey '20 of Mullica Hill, N. J.; Dr. Leo F. Rettger, head of the department of bacteriology at Yale University; and Dr. Edward H. Dusham, head of the department of zoology and entomology here.

Co-eds 'Socially' More Intelligent, Woman M.A. Says

That Penn State women are socially more intelligent than Penn State men is the conclusion drawn from the results of a study made last year by Mildred L. Mulkin, for her master's degree.

The study was based on the scores made by 169 members of the class of 1932 in the George Washington University social intelligence tests.

The tests were divided into six groups: judgment in social situations, memory for names and faces, recognition of mental states from facial expressions, observation of human behavior, social information, and recognition of the mental state of the speaker.

In comparison with scores made by seventy-eight State College high school sophomores, Miss Mulkin found that College students averaged twenty-six points higher.

The scores of College men exceeded those of high school boys by twenty-nine points, while college women averaged only twenty-three points higher than high school girls.
