

HARRIERS TO OPEN SEASON TOMORROW

Cross-country Team Will Meet Panther Runners in Race On 6-Mile Course

In their initial dual meet of the season Penn State's intercollegiate championship cross-country team will meet the University of Pittsburgh harriers tomorrow afternoon over the varsity six-mile course.

The varsity meet will begin during the second quarter of the football game and the race will end between the halves. This system was used last year at the Syracuse meet and proved to be satisfactory. In addition to the varsity meet the Panther plebs and the Lion freshmen will run over a three-mile course. The freshman meet will start after the varsity run, but the yearling harriers will finish before the completion of the varsity race.

Led by Captain "Sonny" Glassburn, the Nittany hill and dalers will be seeking to extend a victory string which began in 1925 when they faced the Pitt team tomorrow. In addition to Glassburn, England, a member of the freshman team last year, Van Cise, King, Greminger, Napoleon, and Space will be entered in the varsity run. Glassburn, Space, Van Cise, and King were members of the varsity last year, while Greminger, Napoleon, and England are newcomers to the squad.

Freshmen To Open Season
Although winning by a perfect score from Allegheny, the Pitt runners have lost to West Virginia and Syracuse. Cise, a junior, Thiele, Smoyer, Watkins, and Lawrence are the most promising members of the Panther team and of these Cise has the best chance of matching strides with the Nittany harriers.

In their only dual meet of the season the untied Lion plebs will meet the Pitt freshmen tomorrow afternoon. The Nittany freshman team will be composed of Harvey, who won the plebs time trials Saturday, Saucers, Masters, Alexander, Michaels, Stauffer, and Platt.

HORSE SHOE TEAM MAY ENTER MEET

National Association Invites School To Compete in Collegiate Pitching Contest

A request that Penn State participate in an intercollegiate horseshoe pitching contest has been received from the American Horse Shoe Pitchers' association by the Physical Education school. Action probably will be taken to have Penn State represented in the competition, according to Dean Hugo Bezdok.

The contest has been arranged on the basis of results of a survey of horseshoe pitching activity in 300 colleges and universities conducted recently by the association. The competition will be open to both men and women students in the colleges asked to take part.

Each entrant will be judged on the number of rings scored in fifty tries. He is entitled to send in ten individual score charts certified by officials of his school. A pair of chromium-plated horseshoes in a leather case will be awarded to the highest scorer up to January 1 and the same award to the highest scorer from that time until April 1.

If a team is not on the field at the specified game time, it automatically forfeits the contest, he said in setting forth new rules. Organizations are held strictly responsible for equipment issued for their use, he added.

Conover Grooms Team To Meet Bellefonte in Next Game Here November 7

With a week intervening before the next home game against Bellefonte Academy here, Coach Larry Conover has been drilling the freshman football eleven on several new plays to be used against the neighboring prep school.

Replacements have been necessary in the first string lineup because of injuries sustained in the Pitt game by Woolbert, 200 pound center, and Harry Sigel, speedy halfback. Woolbert may be out for some time with a dislocated shoulder, but the Bellefonte star's infected foot is expected to heal in time for him to see service against Bellefonte.

Hayward has been doing good work at the snapper-back position in the week's workouts, and Douglas has taken Sigel's place in the signal drills. Conover has also shifted Allen from end to guard in an attempt to strengthen the defense.

Averages 171 Pounds
With two defeats already chalked up against them, the yearling gridmen are pointing for a victory over the Academy here before they face the strong Kiski Prep eleven at Saltsburg two weeks from tomorrow. Bobby Heald, manager of the freshman eleven, took advantage of some off-time this week to figure out the team weight averages. He found that the team averages 174 pounds, the individual line average is 179, and the backfield median is 165 pounds.
