"From hour to hour keep awake," admonished Rev. Howard Thurman, student pastor at Spelman and More-house Colleges, Atlanta, Ga, in the chapel address to alumm and students in Schwab audstorium Sunday moin-

Addressing a Penn State audience for the first time, Reverend Thurman warned against an attitude of mind that makes us oblivious of the oidinary, commonplace things in life.

The world loses meaning for us when in our private lives we follow a course of conduct that is unworthy of our good sense, he said, in his address, "The Tragedy of Dull Mindedness." If a man keeps calling the good things in life the bad things, he is soon unable to distinguish between night and evil.

"Is your life insignificant to you, does it seem to be a griming skall and clossbones?" the speaker asked. "If it does, attach yourself to something worthwhile, for the key to life and to the significance of the world her within ourselves," he said.
