

NITTANY COURTMEN HOLD SCRIMMAGES

Lion Coach Usés Davis, Walus, Brand, Meyers, McMinn As First Quintet

Although already greatly hampered by injuries, the varsity basketball five showed considerable improvement over their early season form in a lengthy scrimmage held following the boxing and wrestling meets Saturday afternoon.

Captain Dutch Hermann used as his first team a quintet composed of Bub Davis and Walus at forward, Captain Freddy Brand at center, and Jack Meyers and Ed McMinn at guard.

Against the reserves, this combination displayed potential power, although it was obvious that the rough edges will have to be smoothed off before the Lions take the floor against Western Maryland the Saturday following Christmas vacation.

McMinn appeared particularly effective as a running guard, and he and Captain Brand seem almost sure of retaining their posts for the opening games, at least.

Shifting Probable Hermann will probably do a lot of shifting at the other positions, however, before the season starts. Walt Moser is slated for one of the forward posts when his injured leg recovers sufficiently for him to take part in the scrimmages and there is an unusually large number of sophomores who may display enough to warrant positions on the varsity.

Injuries continue to hinder Hermann in his attempts to institute a new running offense. Joe Rubin, who had been holding a second-string guard post, may be out of practice until after the vacation with a strained tendon, and Captain Brand and Jack Meyers are still feeling the effects of minor leg injuries.
