No hammer-throwing event will leave Penn State captives in their quest for their second victory over a North Carolina track team at Chapel Hill, N. C. tomorrow afternoon.

Bill Edwards, recently elected captain, will not make the trip to compete against the strongest Lion opponent on the schedule this year. The Tar Heels recently won their twelfth consecutive State crown by a large margin, and have gained victories in both of their dual meets this season.
