

# Bob Higgins, Lion Football Mentor To Teach Coaches

## Newly Appointed Court Leader Will Handle Basketball

Bob Higgins, Penn State's head football coach, will offer a three-weeks course in football coaching during the first half of Summer Session. At the conclusion of this course, Earl E. Leslie, new basketball mentor of the College, will present a three-weeks course in basketball coaching.

Both courses are designed for high school and normal school coaches. Under Higgins the class will take up theory and practice of fundamentals, style of play used at Notre Dame and University of Pittsburgh, offensive and defensive formations, individual positions, strategy of the game, and interpretation of the 1932 rules with special emphasis on the new changes instituted last winter.

Special subjects include linemen coming out as interferences in offensive play, different defenses against forward passes, quarterback strategy, preparing a team for a game, duties of backfield men, early season training, training table, how to scout a team, and sportsmanship.

Captained Lion Eleven  
In his basketball coaching course Leslie will take up theory of play, passing, goal throwing, rules, team-play, conditioning the team, styles of play, and methods of coaching. Principles discussed will be practiced in regular games.

The greatest end ever produced at Penn State, Higgins explained the national championship eleven in 1919. His memorable play of catching a forward pass behind his own goal line and running for a touchdown enabled the Lions to defeat Pitt in 1919. He was chosen end on Walter Camp's All-American team in 1919 as well as being recognized as one of the outstanding wingmen of all time by John W. Heisman.

### TEACHERS, PRINCIPALS PETITION SCHOOL AUDIT

### HAMAS ONLY LION 5-LETTER WINNER

1929 Graduate, Defeated in Ring by Loughran Wednesday, Holds 29 Victories Record

Steve Hamas, who lost a ten-round decision to Tommy Loughran at Shibe Park, Philadelphia, Wednesday night, was graduated from Penn State in 1929 as its only five-letter man in sports.

Hamas' loss to Loughran came after two victories over the Philadelphia in former meetings, the first by a second-round knockout in Madison Square Garden, New York, in January, and the second by a ten-round decision at the Arena on May 11.

Wins 25 By Knockouts  
The Penn State graduate has engaged in thirty-one professional battles since graduation, having won all but one of them until overcome by Loughran Wednesday. Twenty-five of his victories were by the knockout trail.

Steve won eleven letters during his collegiate career, spreading his athletic interests among football, basketball, track, lacrosse, and boxing. He plans to continue his studies at a medical school when he has tried of the professional ring.

### 3 LIONS TO SEEK OLYMPIC BERTHS

#### Captain Stoop, Lewis, Updegrave Will Meet Amateurs in California Ring

Penn State will send two national intercollegiate ring title-holders and a third-place winner into the Olympic boxing trials at Los Angeles, Cal., this month.

Al Lewis, foremost intercollegiate welterweight, Davy Stoop, 118-pound champion, and Pete Updegrave, 100-pound third-place holder, will carry the Blue and White to Olympic competition as the result of selections made during the national intercollegiate held here this spring.

To Engage Amateurs  
Lewis and Stoop have returned to the College following an intensive period of training at Syracuse University last month. They will be joined here by Updegrave this week to embark immediately on the trip to the Coast.

The three Penn State ringmen are having their transportation guaranteed by a backer who pledged his financial support to the boxers this spring. All three men, who boxed for the Nittany team this year, will meet national amateur representatives in the Los Angeles trials.

Men who place in the I. C. A. A. A. competition will enter the second round of the regular Olympic trials. Captain-elect Dunaway established a record of capturing first place in the half-mile run in every dual meet in which he competed last season.

### INTRAMURAL CONTESTS LEAD IN SPORTS HERE

Tournaments for Group Competition Started 3 Years Ago

Intramural sports competition is the most important phase of Penn State's "athletics for all" policy. This type of contest was instituted at the College three years ago by Director Hugo Bezdek, of the School of Physical Education, former head football coach.

Intramural sports are directed by a council of student leaders collaborating with Physical Education officials. Managers are appointed for each sport—football, basketball, wrestling, et cetera—whose duty it is to arrange for tournaments open to all student groups.

Fraternities are the most regular groups to enter intramural contests, although non-fraternity teams increased in prominence last year. Trophies are presented to tournament winners.
