**3 Penn State Men Play Major Part in Largest Single Russian Undertaking**

The largest single undertaking of the Russian Five-Year plan is under the direction of the internationally known engineering firm which was founded and is now headed by Arthur G. McKee, Penn State graduate of 1891.

William A. Haven '09, as vice-president of Arthur G. McKee and Company, first handled the organization of the work on the Russian contract at Cleveland, O., and for the past year was in charge of the firm's activities in the U. S. S. R. A. L. Poell '14, chief engineer of the McKee Company, is the other Penn State alumnus intimately connected with the project.

The Magnitogorsk Mines and Metallurgical Plant is a huge industrial undertaking, combining the building of a great dam across the Ural River valley, development of one of the best and largest deposits of iron ore and another of flux stone, and a complete factory for the production of refractories.

It also includes a 300,000 kilowatt steam-electric power station, the second largest by-product coke plant in the world, eight blast furnaces of the largest capacity, steel making and rolling departments of corresponding size, and a full complement of auxiliary foundries, machine shops and fabricating establishments.

This is the gigantic project being carried out by the McKee firm. A commission of fifteen Russian engineers brought the basic data for the designing of Magnitogorsk to America during the spring of 1930, and for almost two years the home office and drafting rooms of McKee and Company were busily occupied with the preparation and specifications for this great undertaking.

In twenty-seven years Arthur G. McKee and Company has grown to be perhaps the largest of its kind which specializes in the field of ferrous metallurgy. Mr. McKee has been responsible for the design, development, and manufacture of some of the most notable and improved types of blast furnaces and steel plant equipment.


