## WILL PLAY GAME HERE TOMORROW

**Coach Walke Revamps Starting  
Lineup for Contest With  
Academy Gridmen**

Free for the first time from the taint of athletic subsidization, a determined Bellefonte Academy eleven will march onto New Beaver field at 2:30 o'clock tomorrow afternoon in a desperate attempt to uphold the quaint old Bellefonte custom of defeating Penn State freshman football teams.

With opposing sides both fighting for the glory of the game and nothing more, it is sure to be a hard-fought contest in which the Lions should come out on top. Although the Academy boys have won only one game out of three this season, they have a fast, gritty team that may cause plenty of trouble for the Nittany yearlings.

**New Team To Start**

Groping for a combination that will definitely click, Coach Nels Walke intends to experiment with a team made up almost entirely of men who did not get a crack at the Pitt freshmen Saturday. Mervine, end, Kessler, center, and Esterly, guard, are the only gridmen starting tomorrow that opened play against the Panthers.

A complete new backfield combination of Dyson, Frazer, Vignola, and Small will be seen against the Academy gridmen, while other newcomers who will complete the line are Cope and Cappola at the tackles, Hilton at guard, and Kensinger at the other end position.

Although Bellefonte has a much lighter line than usual, they administered a 12-to-0 defeat to an Altoona team in their opening game. Cook Academy scored in the last half minute of play to down Bellefonte 8-to-7 two weeks ago, while the Lock Haven Independents, a strong professional team starring Judy Lasich, 1931 Lion grid captain, scored one touchdown against the Academy gridmen.
