LION SCORES MADE BY O'HARA, COOPER

Confer, Kelly Gain Yardage for Academy Team—Nittany Lineup Altered

Casting off the spell of defeat that has enshrouded Lion yearling grid teams for the past three years, the freshman eleven outsmarted a plodding Bellefonte Academy team, 14-0, here Saturday afternoon.

Coach Neils Walke's lads played a smoother brand of football than they showed against the Pitt freshmen last week. Among other things, they made a habit of recovering Bellefonte fumbles and their own kicks near the Academy goal line to their special advantage.

The Lion scores came in the first and third periods of the game. After kicking to Bellefonte's twenty-yard stripe, the yearling gridgers grabbed the ball on a fumble. F. O'Hara broke away around right end for a touchdown on the next play and Cooper made the extra point good.

Changes Lineup
Late in the third quarter, the Nittany freshmen completed a twenty-yard pass, and marched steadily down the field to the Bellefonte one-yard line. Cooper took the ball over the goal and again made a placement kick count. The Academy gridmen

threatened to score only once during the entire game.

By virtue of a constant stream of short line plunges, Confer and Kelly, Bellefonte backs, succeeded in piling up twelve first downs to State's six. The Lion freshmen, however, completed twice as many passes as the visitors.

Coach Walke made a number of last minute changes in the starting lineup. Fry and Mervine manned the end positions, Sloan and O'Neill took the tackle berths, Cresswell and Latorre held guard posts, and Kessler was seen again at center. Maurer, Andrews, F. O'Hara, and Cooper started in the backfield.

Nittany Booters Conquer Haverford Soccermen, 3-1

Fighting desperately and presenting an inspired attack, a strong Haverford soccer team again made a determined effort to down the Lion for the first time, but once again the Lion asserted his supremacy, as the Nittany booters defeated the Main Liners at Haverford by a 3-to-1 score Saturday.

With the start of the game Haverford unloosed a well-planned attack working the ball toward the Nittany goal with machine-like precision and Ted Brown, Orange and Black center forward, succeeded in kicking a goal within the first minute of play.

Lions Take Offense

Immediately the Jeffrey-coached eleven took the offense and from then on the Haverford team was kept on the defense until the end of the contest. With a well-polished passing system, the Nittanymen held the ball

for the greater part of the game in the shadow of the Main Line goal.

The first Nittany Lion score came near the end of the first period when Shorty Edwards sent a swift ball right through the hands of Lanky Al Zintl, Haverford's goalkeeper. Zintl's fine work in protecting the goal was the big factor in limiting the Lion booters to three goals.

Repeating the whirlwind drive begun in the first quarter, the Lion booters found the Haverford goal for the remaining two points early in the second period. Eddie Knecht sent a long one flying out of the reach of the lanky Zintl and Shorty Edwards followed him a few minutes later with a neatly placed kick into the corner of the net.

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
