#### Today's Election Will Not Determine Economic Recovery, Hasek Declares

The election of either Hoover or Roosevelt will make little difference as far as the economic recovery of the country is concerned, according to Dr. Carl W. Hasek, head of the department of economics and sociology.

"There is nothing to the political propaganda being spread by the Republicans that Hoover must be relected to insure the continued upward trend," he added. "Slumps and recoveries come in spite of politics."

Showing that there is a distinct upward movement in industry and prosperity in the country, Dr. Hasek said that the inventories of almost every business show a great depletion. Industry must be put to work to fill them again, he added.

"The steel industry has increased its production from twelve to nincteen little if anything to do with the business upturn."
