

Freshman Grid Eleven Bows to Wyoming Seminary, 25-0

Heavier Opponents Swamp Plebes in Season's Finale

Bowed by the tremendous weight of the Wyoming Seminary eleven, the freshman gridlers closed their season at Kingston Saturday by being shoved into the mud, 25-to-0.

Battling in a downpour of rain, the Lion cubs resisted the powerful onslaught of the Seminary team for the first two periods of the game, the count at the end of the half showing only a six-point margin for the Wyomings. Toward the end of the game, however, the crushing drive of the 193-pound Kingston line completely tore down the slightest semblance of a Nittany defense.

Captain Hazinsky and Medwick, backs, alternately skipped across

State's goal line on long field runs to account for the Kingston victory. For the Lions, O'Hara, Cooper, and Maurer, yearling captain, did their best to stop the machine-like Wyoming attack.
