

RESEARCH WORKERS ADDED TO M. I. STAFF

Outside Financial Aid Permits New Members, Gauger Announces

Five new members have been added to the staff of research workers at the mineral industries experiment station as a result of financial assistance received from outside agencies. Dr. Alfred W. Gauger, director of mineral industries research, announced recently.

Dr. Elliot P. Barrett, former assistant in chemistry at Columbia University, will study the clinkering of coal. Dr. J. H. Lum, chemical and fuel engineer, and O. P. Brysch, who came here from the Koppers Research corporation, will work on the ignition temperatures and oxidation velocity of anthracites, while Dr. F. J. Williams, formerly of the Ohio State University and the Columbia Branch of the Bureau of Standards, will study the effects of moisture on coal.

Glen Burgener '30, the fifth member of the staff, returned here from the University of Utah where he spent the last two years making microscopic studies of opaque minerals.
