522 APPLICANTS ACCEPTED BY COLLEGE FOR NEXT YEAR

According to the latest figures released by William S. Hoffman, College registrar, 522 applicants have been accepted for the coming freshman class. Last year at this same time 525 freshmen had been accepted.

While the total number of applications received this year is nearly 300 under that of the same time last year, the number of admissions offered this year, using the same standards as were used before, is 795 while last year it was 674. Of the 522 now accepted, 84 percent graduated in the upper two-fifths of their high school classes.
