Illinois from Maine township high school at Desplains, Illinois, where he was a member of the track, football, swimming and basketball teams. In the track events his favorite event was the high jump but he was hardly a star.

At the University, the lanky youngster, standing six feet three inches, went out for track and won his numerals. Discerning latent possibilities in the recruit, Gill at once set Werner to hurdling although he also high jumped, clearing the bar at five feet eleven inches.

Chosen captain by his team-mates in his senior year, 1926, Werner came into his own. He broke or equalled some record in every meet in which he competed and tied his first world's record, running the 60-yard high in 7.5 in the Big Ten indoor meet. He later ran under the colors of the Illinois athletic club where he shattered a world's record in the 50-yard low hurdles.

**Former Lion Hurler May Lead Yanks
In Belated Spurt for League Flag**

Russ Van Atta, former Lion moundsman now with the Yankees, who has consistently beaten the league-leading Washington Senators, may be the key man in a late season attempt on the part of the Yanks to realize a slim mathematical pennant chance to seize the flag from the Senators.

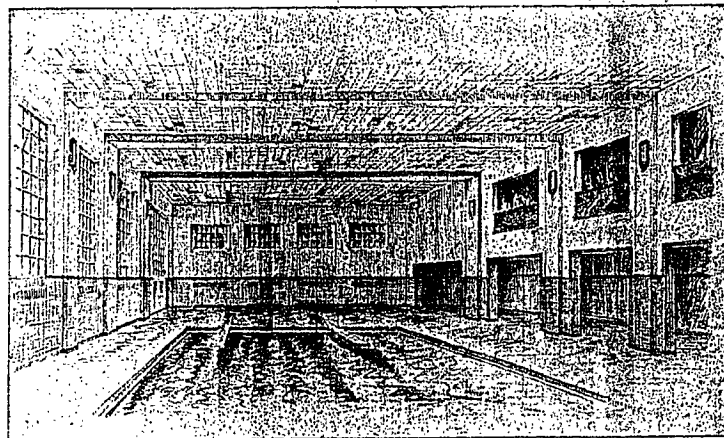
Van Atta, who is pitching his first season of major league ball with the New York club, has been the only Yankee hurler who has had any success against the pace-setting Senators. To date, he has started six games against Washington and, al-

though he failed to finish three of them, the Yanks won them all.

His record for the season thus far is eleven victories against four defeats, including three wins over the St. Louis Browns. Since the season does not close until the end of September, he still has opportunity to win fifteen games in his first major league season.

Following the 1928 Lion season, Van Atta joined a minor league club and later was sold to the St. Paul club, of the American association. Last season he won twenty-two games even though St. Paul finished the association race in the cellar. On the strength of this showing he was sold to the Yanks last winter.
